

How to Avoid the Annoying Challenges of Video Chatting

Video chatting with applications like Skype, Google+ Hangouts, and FaceTime is a great way to enjoy face-to-face conversations with friends and family in other places. However, as you may have already discovered, there can be annoyances including unflattering angles and poor image quality. Check out these tips to make the most of video chatting:

Pick the perfect place. For the most flattering appearance, position yourself so you're facing a sunny window. If there isn't a window nearby or it's dark outside, choose a well-lit spot like the kitchen and make sure a lamp's light is coming toward you at face level. Having light coming from above or below creates dark shadows.

Position the camera at eye level. One of the main reasons people look bad during video chats is that the computer or tablet is placed low on a desk or lap, meaning the head is tilted downward. Being shot from the chin upward is the most unforgiving angle possible. As a quick fix, prop up your device with a stack of books.

Look straight into the camera. Resist the temptation, driven by concern about your appearance, to stare at your own miniaturized image on screen. Instead, think of the camera as the other person and give it eye contact. If you follow the preceding tips, you should be looking pretty good anyway.

Give extra help to non-techy family members. If you want, for example, to Skype with grandparents not familiar with this technology, set up the account for them and do some practice calls while you're in the next room. Also, print out the information they need, such as their username and password, and move the Skype icon to the desktop for easy access.
